Health and Safety Specification (C4)

Safety requirements are to be in accordance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act 85 of 1993 and the Construction Regulations 2003.

The Principal Contractor shall develop an Occupational Health and Safety Plan in accordance with this specification, which may be extended by the George Municipality or its safety representative when the Contract is awarded, and the George Municipality or its safety representative shall approve it.

- 1. All workers must wear PPE at all times overalls, safety boots, reflective vest, hard hats, work gloves and safety glasses.
- 2. The site or work area must be demarcated off by means of a screen or danger tape.
- Contractor must place signage indicating that property in question is a construction site; danger signs and any other relevant signage must be placed on fence / screen.
- 4. Temporary traffic signs must be placed in the road to reduce on coming vehicle's speed and to show that there are labourers at work.
